#### 1. Nature of business

The Whistler Chamber of Commerce ("WCC") is a not-for-profit membership organization incorporated in 1967 under the Board of Trade Act. The purpose of WCC is to make business easy for its members with an overall vision to elevate Whistler's business. WCC is exempt from income tax under section 149(l) of the income tax act. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is recorded in these financial statements.

### 2. Property, plant and equipment

### 3. Prepaid Membership Fees

Annual membership fees are assessed for the September 1 to August 31 year. Amounts received prior to August 31 for the subsequent year are recorded as deferred revenue as they are not earned.

In 2002, WCC entered into a 69 year commercial lease transaction with a rent obligation of \$400,000. In 2003, having prepaid \$100,000 towards the rent obligation, WCC assigned the lease to the Resort Municipality of Whistler ("RMOW"), who prepaid the outstanding balance of \$300,000. The RMOW now holds the lease on the property with WCC as a sub-tenant.

WCC recognizes restricted contributions as revenue using the deferral method. As such, the \$300,000 received from the RMOW was recorded as deferred revenue and is recognized as revenue on a straight-line basis over the 69 year lease term, equal to \$4,348 per annum.

The prepayment of \$400,000 was recorded as a prepaid asset and is recognized as an expense on a straight-line bases over the 69 year lease term equal to \$5,797 per annum. The lease requires WCC to pay for the annual maintenance (triple-net) expenses.

#### 5. Credit facilities and loans

WCC has an available line of credit of \$10,000 secured by a General Security Agreement. Interest is charged at bank prime rate plus 1% per annum. There were no outstanding advances under the line of credit as at August 31, 2020.

During the year WCC received a \$40,000 Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) loan from the federal government, as part of the government's economic response to the pandemic COVID-19. The loan is interest free and 25% of the loan is forgivable if fully paid by December 31, 2022.

#### 6. Deferred revenue

WCC follows the deferred method of accounting and recognizes revenue from restricted contributions when the related event or service has taken place. As a result, amounts received from the RMOW, sponsors, and members for programs and events that will take place in the next fiscal year are recorded as deferred revenues.
